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PCCEO UPDATES

2023 – 2024 School Council Innovation Grant (SCIG) Application

The <u>School Council Innovation Grant</u> (SCIG) is funded by the <u>Engagement GSN</u>. The Board received an allocation of \$263,500 for projects that demonstrate a commitment to respecting the role of parents/caregivers in students' educational experiences. From these funds, \$160,000 (61%) was allocated to support the SCIG. The grant application went live on September 20, 2023, and closed on November 3, 2023. There were 273 applications requesting a total of \$417,255.14. Decisions were released on November 24, 2023. Further information on the SCIG can be found on the SCIG web page.

- On Friday, November 24, 2023, during the process of notifying school councils about the status of their grant application, we experienced a technical issue during the mail merging of files that resulted in applicants receiving multiple conflicting communications regarding their grant application status. Some School Councils received a notification that their application had been approved when it had not. Immediately after becoming aware of what had occurred, all applicants were notified of the error and our office has taken the following steps to rectify the situation:
- On Monday, November 27, 2023, all applicants received a communication that outlined the error that occurred along with the next steps, and the SCIG <u>FAQ</u> was updated to provide information on the error
- On Tuesday, November 28, all successful applicants received a phone call to confirm their success and the amount. The phone call was followed up with an email with the funding agreement. Unsuccessful applicants were also contacted by an e-mail that outlined the reason (e.g. did not meet eligibility criteria or limited funds) for being declined and the opportunity to appeal the decision.
- The <u>applicants'</u> list is viewable by trustee, school, or project.
- This interim update is in response to the request for a report and will be followed up with an end-of-year summary of activities.

 Of the 273 applicants 93 were Model Schools and 45 were approved with a total allocation of \$62,320.

The entry point to Middle French Immersion for the September 2024/25 school year is **Grade 4**.

The application to the Middle French Immersion program will remain an online process and applications must be completed online between **January 8 and February 2, 2024**. An offer of placement in the program (<u>not</u> a specific school) is guaranteed to all eligible on-time applicants. Families with an older sibling currently in a Middle French Immersion program are still required to complete an online application for the new student.
